BROWN: We are just about 15 minutes away from "Latino in America." Our panel back now to talk about Latino political power, how it's changing the landscape for all Americans, not just Latinos.

We're still a small number within the Congress, of the 435 members in the House of Representatives. **There are about 24 of us**, but that's going to expand greatly as we continue forward.

BROWN: Yes. Go ahead, Congressman.


BECERRA: Campbell, my parents are immigrants. My father got to about the sixth grade. My mother came from Guadalajara, Jalisco, Mexico where she married my father at the age of 18. They spoke nothing but Spanish.

Today, **I'm having trouble getting my girls to remember how to speak Spanish, and so within a generation or two you see the transition very quickly. I don't think anyone should fear people wanting to know only a different language.** The first thing you see when you go to a kindergarten playground is that that young child who doesn't speak English is trying to do everything possible, yearning to be able to associate with the other kids in the playground. They want to learn English, and they will.

You stated in this CNN interview that your mother was from Guadalajara. And your bio said you were born in Sacramento.

Ancestry.com shows the following Sacramento birth:



Could you please provide documentation that your mother's name was Schmidt. This is the only Xavier Becerra (from Sacramento) that is discovered on the California Birth Index. I highly doubt that this could be your birth record. If it is not, then please provide the proof that you would be a "birthright" citizen at least.

As you know, a birthright citizen is based on the unconstitutional Supreme Court decision that stated the 14th Amendment, which originally referred to newly freed black slaves making them CITIZENS of the United States.

So, if you are a birthright citizen, please provide proof that you were at least WERE BORN IN THIS STATE as per your bio.

And, please provide proof your mother's maiden name was SCHMIDT.

To hold the office of Attorney General you MUST be a U.S. Citizen. The California Constitution demands that only U.S. Citizens can vote or be voted on:

CALIFORNIA CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE 2 VOTING, INITIATIVE AND REFERENDUM, AND RECALL

*SECTION 2. A **United States citizen** 18 years of age and resident in this State may vote.*

PREAMBLE

***We, the People of the State of California**, grateful to Almighty God for our freedom, in order to secure and perpetuate its blessings, do establish this Constitution.*

And as you can see, the CA CONSTITUTION is only for **WE THE PEOPLE. Non-citizens are NOT considered in that category. Since you hold a State Office, you MUST be a U.S. Citizen:**

CA Constitution ART 3, Sec 8:

*(l) **"State officer,"** as used in this section, means the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, **Attorney General**, Controller, Insurance Commissioner, Secretary of State, Superintendent of Public Instruction, Treasurer, member of the State Board of Equalization, and Member of the Legislature.*

Again, please provide sufficient proof that you were indeed BORN IN THE UNITED STATES. It would also help if you would provide proof that your mother and father eventually became naturalized citizens. Are they, as the 14th Amendment states, "All persons born or naturalized in the United States**, and subject to the jurisdiction thereof, are citizens of the United States..." Did your parents ever become subject to the **jurisdiction** of the U.S.A.? If they never became naturalized, how can you be naturalized? Your bio said you attended school in Spain. Did you use an American passport or Mexican passport?**
